5.2 Enbridge Pipelines Inc. Line 9 Reversal

WHEREAS Enbridge Pipelines Inc. (Enbridge) is seeking approval from the National Energy Board (NEB) for the flow reversal between Hamilton and Montreal to an eastward direction and capacity expansion to 300,000 barrels per day of the existing Line 9 pipeline, including an allowance for the transportation of heavy crude oil products;

AND WHEREAS Environment Canada reports that oil products are harmful to aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems;

AND WHEREAS the pipeline integrity and other preventative and emergency response measures are paramount to minimizing the likelihood of a release and for the protection of the community and the environment;

AND WHEREAS failure of the pipeline will lead to oil products release into the environment and contamination of our waterways;

AND WHEREAS currently only one remote controlled isolation valve is located in the Region of Halton along the Enbridge Line 9 pipeline;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Enbridge be requested to install isolation valves on each side of watercourses to provide enhanced environmental protection and improve the

potential for minimization of environmental contamination of our waterways and health and safety impacts in the event of a pipeline failure;

AND the National Energy Board be requested to require the installation of isolation valves on each side of watercourses to provide enhanced environmental protection and improve the potential for minimization of environmental contamination of our waterways and health and safety impacts in the event of a pipeline failure.
