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### Road Tour Meeting Notes

#### 1.0 Tour

1.1 The following areas were viewed and noted, as directed by the Director of Public Works: Concession 6 potential paving, Willoughby Street upgrades proposed for 2018, Inglis Street issues with Rogers and Westario Power Inc. infrastructure removal, Bruce County Highways final landscaping at new works shed, Bruce County Highways plans for Campbell Street, Bruce County Highways planned re-alignment of Bruce Road 1 at Kinloss, the Township gravel pit on Paradise Lake Street, Snobelen Trail resident request to use drainage easement property to access rear yard, dead end issues on Park Street, Ojibwa Trail drainage issue, Woodhaven area of Point Clark - one of the last remaining sections still to be upgraded, and finally the Smith Lane easement requirement for the Lurgan Beach water project.

#### 2.0 Discussions

2.1 The Director of Public Works hosted information stops at the Ripley Municipal Parking lot to explain the Westario Power Inc. issue with servicing the proposed elevated tank, and that a diesel, not propane, fueled generator will be installed to supply emergency power to the tank and the Ripley Huron Community Centre, the Lucknow Community Centre to view parking lot drainage, the "Old" Fire Hall to view areas of excavation planned on Inglis Street, Walter Street, and the potential extension of

municipal servicing for the Music in the Fields event and an alignment issue at Concession 4 and Lake Range Drive.

2.2 The Director of Community Services hosted information stops at the North Baseline walking trail, the unopened road allowance on Saratoga Road to be used as a connecting link for a walking trail between Penetangore Row S and Boiler Beach Road, and how it connects to the existing beach walkway constructed last year, the tree damage and plans for clean-up of Heritage Park, the perceived overgrowth of the beach by willows, shrubs, etc. at the Concession 10 walkway, potential use of the cottage removal area on Boiler Beach Road and potential areas to install hitching rails for the Mennonite community members who visit the beach.
