5.4 Demonstrated Need for Aggregates

WHEREAS it is widely acknowledged that extracting aggregates from the landscape is an intrusive activity that has the potential to cause long-term impacts on publicly important environmental resources and farmland; increases in traffic, road damage and greenhouse gas emissions; and degrades the quality of life in local communities; and

WHEREAS in 2005 the Provincial Policy Statement was amended to allow aggregate producers to propose extraction sites without having to demonstrate the need for the additional supply of aggregated resources, thereby creating a barrier to comprehensive planning and favouring the protection of aggregate extraction at the expense of other provincial interests, and as a result encouraging the rapid and non-sustainable use of the resource; and

WHEREAS the applications for licences under the current Aggregate Resources Act do not require proponents to demonstrate need to extract aggregate resources in a particular area;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Township of Huron-Kinloss Council hereby endorses the resolution of the Municipality of Trent Lakes and in so doing calls on the Government of Ontario to amend the Provincial Policy Statement and the Aggregate Resources Act to require aggregate extraction proponents to demonstrate need for the particular supply of resource proposed for extraction.

5.7 Solar Panel Proposal (Dairy Barn)

EthoSolar Inc. is looking to carry out a solar panel project they have proposed for 3065 Concession 4, Ripley (Jonathan Wilken). The solar panel will be mounted on the roof of the dairy barn. Jonathan has previously been approved by Council for a project at his property located at 3066 Concession 4.

STAFF COMMENTS: The Independent Electricity System Operator (ieso) has launched its revised Feed-in-Tariff (FIT) Program as of July 13th, 2015 (now FIT 4.0). Jonathan Wilken is applying to install a solar project at 3065 Concession 4, Ripley. The Simcoe County Community Energy Co-op (SCCEC 4.0 LP) is seeking support from the Township of Huron-Kinloss Council with respect to this project to meet the requirements from the Independent Electricity System Operator. Council had previously supported Jonathon Wilken when he had applied for the FIT 3.0 in November 2013 through the Teeswater Community Power Co-op and the FIT 2.0 in November 2012 through the Simcoe County Community Power Energy Co-operative. Neither of these applications were successful. A resolution has been prepared for your consideration based on the request.

46 WHEREAS in December 2014 the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) completed the first phase of preliminary assessments Step 3, Phase 1, in collaboration with the community of Huron-Kinloss; and

WHEREAS the assessment identified that the Adaptive Phased Management Project has potential to align with our communities long term goals and our community was assessed as having potential to meet strict safety and geotechnical requirements;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Township of Huron-Kinloss Council wishes to continue to learn more and proceed to the next phase of study and learning in Step 3, Phase 2, and retains its ability to end the community participation in the NWMO Site Selection process at any time; and

FURTHER THAT Huron-Kinloss Township Council hereby authorizes the NWMO to proceed to develop plans for initial field studies which may include bore hole drilling, 2-D seismic surveys and general geologic observation in Huron-Kinloss which will be focused on regional geology; and

FURTHER THAT Huron-Kinloss Township Council hereby approves NWMO exploring options for using municipal land that may be available for consideration in the planning for this early phase of study.

7.2 124 Bell Drive Shed

As indicated at the Planning Meeting on April 27th there is a shed located on the beach area at 124 Bell Drive.

STAFF COMMENTS: The applicant was agreeable to enter an Encroachment Agreement for the continued existence of the shed. However, staff contacted the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry as per our Beach Management Agreement and they have indicated that it is an old structure and they have no concern with it at the present time.

Therefore, it is our recommendation we notify the resident an Encroachment Agreement is not required and file the correspondence received from the Ministry in the property.

SUSTAINABILITY ALIGNMENT: The information provided in this report is consistent with and in keeping with the Municipality's Vision & Mission. The *recommendations* or *actions* contribute to our goals in achieving a *prosperous, vibrant, spirited, accessible and environmentally conscious* community.

ACTION: There is still concern with the dune destruction surrounding the shed as well as a deck at a neighbouring cottage. The Director of Community Services and CBO will attend to view the area and report back at the June General Committee meeting on any restorative actions that may be taken.

7.3 Planning Meetings

We will be adding a Special Planning Meeting for one application at the June 15th Council meeting.

The Bruce County Planning department is expressing concern with our bi-monthly planning meetings now that it is again busier with planning applications.

STAFF COMMENTS: It is my recommendation that we revise the Planning Meeting Schedule to reflect monthly meetings again for the fourth Monday of the month. If a Planning Meeting needs to be cancelled it is easier than providing notice for additional meetings as per the Procedural By-law. This also assists residents who are trying to build or develop so they are not waiting potentially 2 months for their application to be heard by the Planning Committee and then another month for passage of the applicable by-law. The County staff are aware we prefer not to hold meetings for one application and will try to schedule accordingly as much as possible.

- 9.1 Deep Geologic Repository Project – Joint Review Panel Environmental Assessment Report Released Publicly
Council has likely heard but a News Release on May 6, 2015 from the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency confirmed release of the Joint Review Panel Environment Assessment Report.

The release stated: Today, the Minister of the Environment, Leona Aglukkaq, received the Report of the Joint Review Panel for the proposed Deep Geologic Repository (DGR) for Low and Intermediate Level Radioactive Waste project in Ontario.

Under the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 2012*, the federal government will now review the Panel's report before issuing a decision statement on whether the project may proceed. If the project is authorized to proceed to the next phase of the permitting process, the decision statement will include conditions related to the project that will be legally binding on the proponent.

Prior to the federal government's decision on the project, the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency will invite Aboriginal groups and registered participants to comment on potential conditions relating to possible mitigation measures and follow-up requirements that could be necessary, if the project is authorized to proceed. These comments will be taken into account by the Minister of the Environment for the decision statement.

Subject to the federal government's decision, the Joint Review Panel, as a panel of the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission under the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act*, will make a decision whether to issue a licence to Ontario Power Generation to prepare a site and construct the deep geologic repository facility.

The [Panel Report](#) which includes a summary, is available on the Canadian Environmental Assessment Registry, registry number 17520.
