4.0 **DELEGATIONS**

4.1 McEwan Branch of the Kennedy Municipal Drain

Greg Nancekivell from Dietrich Engineering will be in attendance to present the report for the Kennedy Municipal Drain –Mc Ewan Branch

STAFF COMMENTS: The report has been attached for your review. Hard copies were provided at the September 17th, 2012 meeting. After discussion with Brian Knox at Bruce County, the September 7th, 2012 assessment schedule will remain the same. Greg Nancekivell will explain further at the meeting.

ACTION: Greg Nancekivell presented the report. There were no concerns raised. An opportunity was provided for residents to add or remove their name from the petition. No landowners were present. The Provisional By-Law will be brought forward later in the meeting.

4.2 Phil Beard & Steve Jackson Maitland Valley Conservation Authority 7:05 p.m.

Maitland Valley Representatives will be doing a power point presentation.

STAFF COMMENTS: They will be discussing projects and certain items pertaining to the watershed area to include the Garvey Glen Project, Rural Storm water management, costs to update the base mapping for the Lucknow Floodplain and the rain gauge network upstream of Lucknow.

ACTION: The representatives reviewed the Glen Garvey Project and measures that are being taken to prevent erosion. The authority is trying to educate on rural storm water management and how to manage the flow of water rather than have it directed to tile drains for quick removal. They stressed that by managing the flow we can mediate erosion issues, the loss of valuable topsoil and make effective use of the water. It was suggested that berms can be useful when incorporated into certain municipal drains. They would have to be incorporated into the engineer's report for the drain and have been on recent projects in Huron-Kinloss. MVCA is very willing to consult on municipal drains and measures where these features may be useful.

Steve Jackson updated Council on the need for flood plain mapping for Lucknow. There is an opportunity to work with the Grand River Conservation Authority to pay minimal dollars for the Lucknow mapping. The flood plain mapping is not only useful for land use planning purposes but for emergency purposes in a flood situation. Rain gauges are now located throughout Lucknow on private property. Now MVCA has 24 hour surveillance. MVCA will provide an updated proposal for Councils consideration at a future meeting on the flood plain mapping and additional rain gauges for Lucknow.

Taralyn will be attending to present the Business Retention & Expansion Final Report.

THAT Huron-Kinloss Township Council hereby supports the Ontario Progressive Conservatives and in so doing calls on the Legislature of Ontario to support the *Ability to Pay Act, 2012* which believes that arbitrators when undertaking a decision should be required to take into account the following criteria as outlined in Bill 121, the *Ability to Pay Act, 2012*, in addition to any other criteria provided by law:

1. National, provincial and local unemployment rates, economic growth rates and personal income levels.
2. A comparison, as between the employees and other comparable employees in the public and private sectors, of the terms and conditions of employment, including remuneration and benefits, and the nature of the work performed.
3. Inherent advantages in bargaining enjoyed by the employees because there is a monopoly on services, because the activities are not carried on for profit, or for both reasons.
4. If applicable, the mandate of elected officials.
5. The fiscal situation of the Province (or, if the employer is a municipality or local board of a municipality, the municipality's fiscal situation).

In applying the criteria, arbitrators shall assume that no tax rate will be increased to pay the costs of the decision or award. Arbitration cases within the entire broader public sector shall be settled within a tight timeline of 3 months; and

WHEREAS Bill 121, the *Ability to Pay Act, 2012*, will legislate these criteria and bring government employee wages back in line with what the municipalities and taxpayers can afford to pay;

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that the Township of Huron-Kinloss Council calls on the Legislature of Ontario to pass the *Ability to Pay Act, 2012*.

Process. Does Council wish to consider this at the November Council meeting?

The International Conference on Geological Repositories website <http://icgr2012.org/conference-proceedings.php> contains all the information presented over the two days. It is there for review. Councillor Abbott found both days very informative.

Mayor Twolan felt commented that there seemed to be the consensus that it is our responsibility to learn how to manage the waste responsibly. It has been determined that a Deep Geological Repository is the best way to handle the spent fuel. Sweden will be the first to host a DGR facility. There are 11,000 tonnes of waste are produced yearly and there needs to be a place to put the used fuel. The hardest part of finding a place is finding the political will to make it happen. The economic benefits to the community are numerous. North Watch attended the conference as did a Native Community that were against the repositories.

Council is concerned with the make up for the Community Liaison Committee. Staff will be speaking with NWMO representatives to obtain more information about the committee. NWMO will be invited to the November 5th General Committee meeting to present an overview of Step 3 prior to a Council decision.

Councillor Hanna suggested a revenue sharing agreement between Bruce County municipalities is a neighborly way to approach this project.
