

Where are we in the process?

STEP 2 Initial Screening (few months) COMPLETE	 For all requesting communities
STEP 3, PHASE 1 Preliminary Assessment (Desktop) (18 months) IN PROGRESS	 For requesting communities that pass Initial Screenings (up to 21) 11 complete 9 in progress, 1 initiated
STEP 3, PHASE 2 Preliminary Assessment (Field Work) (3-4 yrs min.) INITIATED 2014	 For small number of communities with high potential 4 in progress
STEP 4 Detailed Site Characterization (~potentially 3-5 years)	With preferred candidate site







Narrowing our Focus

Early 2015 (date to be set):

- The NWMO will publish Preliminary Assessment Reports and series of supporting reports for 9 communities completing Phase 1
- NWMO will identify small number of communities invited to advance to Phase 2
- This information will be communicated in an organized way in each of the communities





Four Key Questions

- Potential to find a safe site?
- Potential to foster well-being of community?
- Potential for citizens' continued interest?
- Potential to foster well-being of surrounding area?



- Finalizing reports and preparing to roll out information in an organized way with each community





Next Steps for Communities Identified for Phase 2 Studies





Phase 1 activities

- Agreement to proceed
 NWMO and accountable authorities
- Safety

Scientific and technical studies of geology

- Community well-being Desktop studies and engagement
- Regional picture
 Engage leaders in First Nations, Métis and other surrounding communities
- Stock-taking

Review findings about potential suitability, identify areas for Phase 2 study





Initial Phase 2 Activities

Initial studies

- Geophysical surveys
- Environmental surveys
- Geological field mapping
- Dialogue and planning with community, Aboriginal communities, surrounding areas
- More intensive learning

Review findings, conclude work in areas with low potential





Later Phase 2 Activities

Intensive field work and engagement

- Limited borehole drilling and testing program
- Explore potential for partnership with:
 - interested community
 - Aboriginal communities
 - surrounding communities

The project will only proceed with the interested community, First Nation and Métis communities and surrounding municipalities working in partnership.
