Registration for the 2025 Golf Car season is open!

Golf cars must be registered in the Golf Car Pilot Project and have a Registration Sticker and a current Validation Sticker to participate and to drive a golf car within the Township.

Golf cars are only permitted on municipal roads with a maximum speed of 50Km per hour or less. Golf cars may operate April 1st to November 30th each year.

Golf Cars are regulated under the Highway Traffic Act.

The Golf Car can be electric or gas powered and must have:

- 1. Two to Six Seats
- 2. Steering Wheel
- 3. Rear-view Mirror(s)
- 4. Horn
- 5. Good-quality Tires
- 6. Daytime Running Lights
- 7. Turn Signals
- 8. Brake Lights
- 9. Reflectors

- 10. Slow-moving Vehicle Sign on Back
- 11. If there are factory installed Seat Belts they must be used by Driver and all Passengers
- 12. Registration Sticker with current Validation Sticker
- 13. Service Brakes and Parking or Emergency Brake

MUNICIPAL

MPAC Property Assessments

MPAC determines property assessments for all properties in Ontario. Municipalities determine revenue requirements, set municipal tax rates and collect property taxes to pay for municipal services. The Government of Ontario establishes the province's assessment and taxation laws and determines education tax rates.

The Ontario government postponed the 2020 Assessment Update due to the Covid-19 pandemic. On August 16, 2023, the Ontario government filed a regulation to amend the Assessment Act, extending the postponement of a province-wide reassessment through the end of the 2021-2024 assessment cycle. Property assessments for the 2025 property tax year will continue to be based on fully phased-in January 1, 2016 current values. This means your property assessment for the 2025 property tax year will be the same as the 2024 tax year, unless there have been changes to your property.

We are continuously reviewing properties. You may have received a Notice for one of the following reasons:

- change to property ownership, legal description, or school support;
- change to the property's value resulting from a Request for Reconsideration, an Assessment Review Board decision, or ongoing property reviews;
- property value increase/decrease reflecting a change to the property; for example, a new structure, addition, or removal of an old structure; or
- change in the classification or tax liability of the property.

Fire Safety

The Fire Stations within the Township of Huron-Kinloss are responsible for the provision of fire and emergency response services, ongoing fire prevention and public education programs.

Fire Permits

Fire permits are issued on an annual basis. Recreational fires are exempt from requiring a permit. The Fire Chief is responsible for administering the Open-Air Burning By-Law. Fire permits are available for purchase at the Municipal Office. The fee is \$40.00. Once a fire permit is obtained the permit holder will be required to call the hotline at 1-800-511-9911 prior to igniting an open air fire.

Emergency Management


For personal emergencies, you must know your 911 or civic address, which is a combination of your house number, street name and name of your Municipality. Your house/cottage/store number should be clearly visible from the road.

In the event of a disaster or large-scale emergency, first responders may be busy assisting those in immediate danger. Its important for you to have a 72 Hour Kit which should hold enough supplies to support you and your family for three days in an emergency.

Along with a 72 hour kit, have an emergency action plan. It will ensure that you and your family members know what to do and who to call.

Garbage, Recycling & Household Waste

The Township of Huron-Kinloss is an environmentally conscious community that is a good steward of our natural environment. We have many programs to help support a healthy environment.

Household Services

Curbside Garbage & Recycling

Garbage and Blue Box pick-up for Huron-Kinloss is carried out by Bruce Area Solid Waste Recycling (BASWR). Garbage is picked up weekly, while Recycling is bi-weekly. All garbage bags must be sealed, have a Huron-Kinloss bag tag/sticker and weigh no more than 18kgs (40lbs). Garbage and Recycling must be at the curb by 8:00 a.m. on collection day.

Bag Tags are available for \$3.00 each at the Municipal Office and various local retailers in Ripley, Amberley, Holyrood, Kincardine, and Lucknow. Please visit www.huronkinloss.com/bag-tags to view the complete list of retailers.

Yard Waste Depots

Yard Waste Depots will accept bagged leaves/grass/garden clipping, brush, and small branches under 6". No logs or stumps! Large dump loads should be taken to the landfill on the days it is open.



New Operating Authority

As of Jan 1, 2025 the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA) assumed the role as the Operating Authority for the water and waste water systems in The Township of Huron-Kinloss. OCWA will support us in continuing to deliver clean, reliable, and safe drinking water to our residents. We thank Veolia for nearly 20 years of dedicated service delivering safe drinking water to our communities. If you

would like to understand more about the Township's water and waste water services in general, please contact the Manager of Environmental Services at the Township office.

Water Source

The Township of Huron-Kinloss is fortunate to have ground-source water systems to deliver safe drinking water to all residents according to the Safe Drinking Water Act. Our water source does indicate presence of Sodium, Fluoride, and Barium (in Whitechurch). These are naturally occurring materials but can present health risks to some individuals. Please see our website under the Live Here/Water, Wastewater & Utilities tab for data and information or contact Grey Bruce Public Health at 1-800-263-3456 for more information.

Water Services

Are you a seasonal resident? If you need your water turned on/off please provide at least 2 days notice to schedule. The homeowner or delegate MUST be on premises when the water is turned on to prevent possible damage due to leaks.

Municipal Roads

Public Works maintains, and is working to improve, approximately 396 km of roadway: 196 km asphalt surfaces, 169 km gravel, and 31 km tar & chip as well as the 104 bridges/structures and 11.8 km of sidewalk.

If you notice an issue such as potholes, broken or missing street signs, a streetlight out, or road side tree trimming, please let us know. We are here to help. You may report issues at any time through our website under the Live Here/Report a Problem tab or call the Municipal Office during office hours 519-395-3735.



The Township's By-Law Enforcement Officer is responsible for enforcing by-laws passed by Council to support public health, safety, and well-being while protecting persons and property. Frequently requested Township by-laws can be accessed online at https://www.huronkinloss.com/town-hall/by-laws/

Township By-Law Q&A

Q: What is the Township's Administrative Monetary Penalty System (AMPS)?

A: AMPS allows by-law related offences to be heard by the Township using independent Screening and Hearing Officers for hearings. The system is a fair and efficient process that relieves provincial court system of its time spent on by-law related offences.

Q: Are business advertisement signs permitted to be placed on the Township's road allowance?

A: As per the Township's Sign By-law, signs are not to be attached to trees, hydro or Township poles or support, or on Township or public property without permission from the Township. Business owners who are in violation of the sign by-law could receive a monetary penalty amount of \$300 per violation.

Q: How does the Noise By-Law pertain to me?

A: General noise must be minimized between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. the next day (9:00 a.m. on Sundays). Every homeowner should be mindful of neighbouring residents and properties at all times to not disturb the natural enjoyment of their properties. This includes persistent barking or whining of domestic pets.

If you are hosting a celebration or gathering, exemptions to the Noise By-law can be requested through Council. You must apply in writing to council at least 6 weeks in advance of the function. Contact the Clerks department at info@huronkinloss.com for further details.

Q: When can I have a family fireworks display?

A: According to our Noise Control By-Law 2005-101, the detonation of fireworks is prohibited in a residential area except in association with Victoria Day and/or Canada Day celebrations. All family members, tenants and renters visiting property in Huron-Kinloss should be made aware of these restrictions.

Q: When am I permitted to water my lawn?

A: The Lawn Watering By-Law No. 2010-46 is in effect from June 1 to Sept. 15 annually. Lawn watering is permitted based on your house number. Even numbered houses may water on even numbered days and odd numbered houses water on odd days of the month. Watering is permitted between 6 and 9 a.m. and 6 and 9 p.m. unless you use an automated sprinkler system, which must be set to run between 4 and 7 a.m. on the property's respective day. Financial penalties will be issued for those in contravention.

Township By-Law Q&A Continued

- Q: Are chickens and other agricultural animals/ livestock allowed on a residentially zoned property?
- A: Chickens and other agricultural animals are only permitted to be located on Agricultural properties according to the Comprehensive Zoning By-Law 2018-98, as amended. This means that if your property is zoned residential or within an urban settlement area, you are NOT permitted to have chickens or other agricultural animals on the property.
- Q: A neighbours' yard has grass and weeds growing more than fifteen (15) cm (6") in height. Is there anything the Township can do to have it cleaned up?
- A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss has the Clean and Clear Yards By-Law No. 2023-52, which deals with non-maintained residential yards. This by-law sets out the minimum standards in which a property must be kept. These health and safety guidelines are in place to protect neighbours as well as the property owners.
- Q: What is Giant Hogweed and what should I do with it?
- A: Giant Hogweed is designated as a noxious weed in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990 and falls under the Clean and Clear Yards By-Law No. 2023-52. It is very hazardous to human health, if the stem oils meet human skin, it may cause severe burns. If an established growth is found on your property, it is recommended that a contractor be hired to remove the growth. Alternatively, if the growth is found at another location, please contact the Township.

- Q: I have a raccoon/skunk hanging around my property. What can I do to get rid of it?
- A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss does not deal with nuisance wildlife. We can provide the names of local trappers and/or private nuisance animal companies that will remove the animal for you at your expense.
- Q: Does the Township have any regulations regarding the waterfront and beachfront area?
- A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss has entered an agreement with the Ministry of Natural Resources to help protect our lakeshore. The following regulations are enforced along the public beachfront:
 - No dogs shall be off leash,
 - No littering and must clean up after pets,
 - No motorized vehicles including golf carts or golf cars on the beach,
 - Shall not alter or destroy sand dunes or create water crossing on road,
 - · Shall not remove any vegetation,
 - Shall not burn any substance without obtaining a burn permit,
 - Shall not construct or place any structure on the beach, and
 - Shall not dredge and fill shoreline.
- Q: Are there regulations to aid with snow removal and alleviate safety concerns during the winter months?
- A: According to the Township of Huron-Kinloss Parking Control By-Law No. 99-20, one must not be parked on a highway or a boulevard between Nov. 1 and April 30, between the hours of 1 and 6 a.m., to ensure roadways get cleared of snow properly.




